In the summer of 2005, McCook started her own company, Glashjärta Glass, in which she sells her functional and wearable art, while continuing to make her sculptural work. McCook often explores multiple processes and materials in her work, including blown and kiln formed glass. She has exhibited her work at a variety of galleries, cafes, and high-end art and craft shows in Illinois and Wisconsin. McCook has studied and/or worked under such artists as William Carlson, José Chardiet, Henner Schröder, Katherine Gray, John Miller, Greg Fidler, Brent Cole, Damon McNaught, and Holly Wolf-Mattick. In addition to being a working artist, McCook has worked and taught at glass studios in the area including Chicago Hot Glass and Making Glass. Most recently McCook worked as the Education Program Director for 3 years at the David Weingberg Gallery, leaving in December 2010. 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artist statement || wearable art + functional forms

I am inspired by observations of colors, forms, textures and patterns found in the natural world and I explore them using glass, metal, and enamels. I find gratification, purpose and value in creating functional art which is used and appreciated in everyday life and living. My work explores not only surface textures and colors, but also interior textures, colors, and spaces. Each piece is carefully and intuitively designed with the highest quality glass and expert crafting. All wearable art is fused from Bullseye Glass and fitted with either sterling silver or gold filled findings, and comes with either a stainless steel and sterling silver neck-lace or a gold filled necklace. All original blown work, including vases, paperweights and ornaments have been created from the highest quality glass in a hot shop glass blowing studio. Each work, whether a piece of wearable art or home decorative ware, is unique and one of a kind.
