<u>"Art Appreciation:"</u> (6 credits) This course is designed to introduce the high-school student to the fundamental's of understanding art within the context of Art History. Students examine the visual elements and design principles necessary to understand and create works of art.

<u>"Abstract and IntuitivePainting:"</u> (1 course non-credit). This course explores the qualities of abstract art through a variety of lenses that students will learn to appropriate into their own individual working process. Students will examine the techniques and methods of the past as well as a variety of contemporary approaches to this subject.

CUMBERLAND COUNTY COLLEGE: Spring 2017-Present. Adjunct Professor.

<u>"Art Appreciation:"</u> (18 credits) This course is designed to introduce the student to the fundamental's of understanding art within the context of Art History. Students examine the visual elements and design principles necessary to understand and create works of art.

<u>HUSSIAN COLLEGE, SCHOOL OF ART: Fall 2012-Present. Adjunct Professor of Fine</u> Arts.

<u>"Studio Painting:"</u> (9 credits) This course is an elective painting workshop that intensifies the properties of additional painting skills beyond the fundamental level. Students explore various visual creative solutions within the broader context of historic as well as contemporary art practices.

<u>"Advanced Studio Painting:"</u> (15 credits) This course is an elective painting workshop that intensifies the properties of additional painting skills into an advanced level. Students explore various visual creative solutions within the broader context of historic as well as contemporary art practices. Students are expected to develop an individual painting style that aligns with their own expressive interests.

<u>"Fundamentals of Painting:"</u> (21 credits) This course is a beginning studio class introduces the student to the medium of acrylic paint. Assignments are designed to encompass a total painting experience and to manipulate the medium to its utmost. Emphasis is placed on the classical painting techniques of color mixing/ theory and form rendering as it applies to still life, portraiture, and landscape.

<u>"Figure Drawing 1 & 2:"</u> (12 credits) The purpose of these courses is to provide each student with specific drawing media experiences in order to hone perceptual skills that relate to the human figure. Students also explore the use of the human figure in relation to art history in order to further enrich their own use of the figure.

<u>"Anatomy for Illustrators:"</u> (12 credits) The purpose of this courses is to provide each student with the knowledge of specific anatomical features and relate these to expressive renditions of the human form. Students examine how the human form has been understood and expressed cross-culturally throughout history.

<u>"Fundamentals of Drawing:"</u> (9 credits) The purpose of this class is to introduce the students to the materials and techniques that enable the translation of 3-dimensional objects into 2-dimensional drawings. Students explore how this has been achieved through cross-culturally throughout history.

<u>"Open Life Drawing"</u> (voluntary) A class open to current students and alumni that allows the individual to keep their drawings skills refined.

THE ART INSTITUTE OF PHILADELPHIA: Fall 2007-Present. Adjunct Professor of Foundation Studies.

<u>"College Bound Color Theory:"</u> (High School 3 credits) This course provides an introduction to the principles of color as they relate to design. Students explore traditional and digital media in their effort to control color in a meaningful way. Students

also examine how color has been used throughout the history of art in order to communicate broader humanistic themes.

<u>"College Bound Design Fundamentals:"</u> (High School 6 credits) This course introduces basic design principals and incorporates them using a variety of traditional and digital media. Students explore masterful examples of design and painting throughout art history in order to effectively understand and manipulate the formal elements of a composition.

<u>"Survey of Graphic Design:"</u> (6 credits) This course is an introduction to the history, principles, elements and vocabulary of graphic design. It is an overview of contemporary design practices and design specialties within the profession and their relation to historical practices.

<u>"Concept Development:"</u> (6 credits) This course focuses on the creative process and explores methods by which students can develop concepts and turn them into finished designs.

<u>"Form and Space:"</u> (21 credits) This course applies basic design principles to the third dimension using a variety of media and methods. Students look at masterful examples of sculpture, and architecture throughout history in order to broaden their understanding of three dimensional design.

<u>"Illustration and Rapid Visualization:"</u> (15 credits) This course discusses the philosophy behind illustration, emphasizing conceptual visual problem solving and quick sketching methods to portray ideas.

<u>"Life Drawing:"</u> (6 credits) This course focuses on the human figure, emphasizing the analytical and expressive means through which this subject can be portrayed. Students also explore the use of the human figure in relation to art history in order to further enrich their own use of the figure.

<u>"Color Theory:"</u> (72 credits) This course provides an introduction to the principles of color as they relate to design. Students explore traditional and digital media in their effort to control color in a meaningful way. Students also examine how color has been used throughout the history of art in order to communicate broader humanistic themes.

<u>"Fundamentals of Drawing:"</u> (54 credits) This course focuses on basic observational drawing techniques so that students can more accurately translate three-dimensional form into two-dimensional renderings. Students explore how this has been achieved through cross-culturally throughout history.

<u>"Fundamentals of Design:"</u> (15 credits)This course introduces basic design principals and incorporates them using a variety of traditional and digital media. Students explore masterful examples of design and painting throughout art history in order to effectively understand and manipulate the formal elements of a composition.

<u>"Analysis of Form."</u> (6 credits) This course explores a variety of drawing techniques and media that range from the classical to the contemporary in order to inform and enhance the students' rendering abilities.

<u>"Portfolio Foundations."</u> (8 courses non credit) This course begins by welcoming students into the Art Institute of Philadelphia community and helping them integrate into this student environment. Students become acquainted with college and community resources, explore their goals for success, and work on establishing a visionary course for the development of their professional portfolio.
