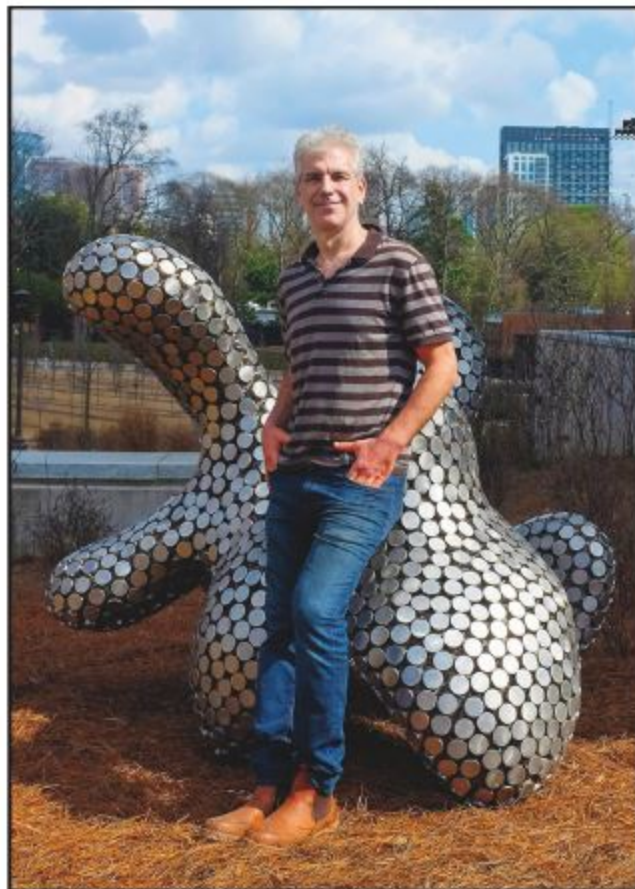




JOSH GARBER

For the past 30 years Chicago based sculptor, Josh Garber, has had solo and group exhibitions in United States and Canada. He has completed public art commissions in Atlanta, Chicago, Cincinnati, Kenosha and Phoenix. He received his BFA from Alfred University and MFA from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago.

Always seeking to expand his practice, Garber attended residencies at Sculpture Space in Utica, New York, the Kohler Residency in Wisconsin, and The Bush Creek residency in Wyoming. Garber is the recipient of the Pollock-Krasner Grant, a Dcase Grant and a Canada Council B Grant.

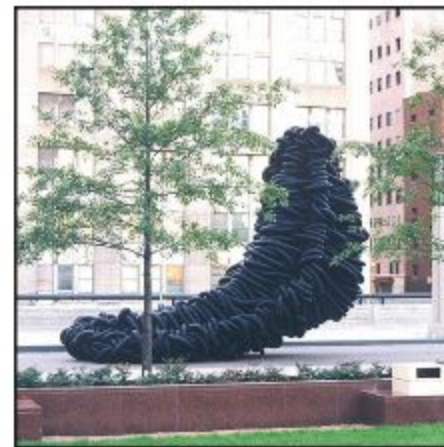

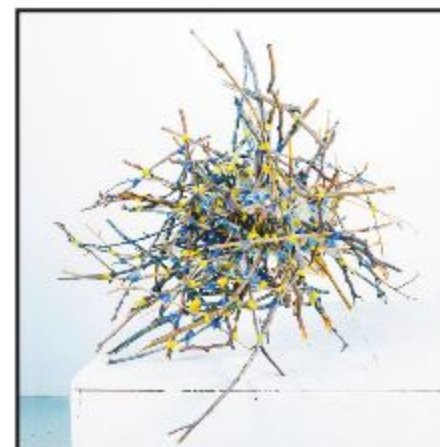
