Mission:

The Steel Yard's historic campus is a platform for professional artists, makers and the community to practice and learn the industrial arts. The organization fosters creative and economic opportunities, by providing workspace, tools, training and education, while forging lasting links to a local tradition of craftsmanship.

Throughout much of the Steel Yard's history, I have had the opportunity to teach community art courses, manage over 200 public-art installations and work alongside hundreds of artists, students, teachers and professional craftspeople. As Executive Director I have helped to lead the organization through a period of rapid growth, expanding the staff from 4 to 11 full time program staff, introducing new artists residencies, educational programs, workforce training and public-art opportunities, and increasing attendance at community cultural events from 2,500 – 15,000 people/year. In 2019 we completed a \$2.7 million dollar capital campaign to fully restore our 12,000 sf industrial studios. It is an honor to work alongside so many talented people, from hugely diverse backgrounds and life-experiences, brought together by the fire arts.

- 2012** – Kennedy Plaza Art-Fence - In partnership with the City of Providence and the National Endowment for the Arts, The Steel Yard organized and collaborated with a team of artists to design, fabricate and install a 350 ft. sculptural fence around the BOA skating center in Providence’s Kennedy Plaza. Community surveys to informed design decisions and incorporated areas for future temporary art installations.
 - Roger Williams National Memorial Speakers’ Corner - The National Park Foundation teamed up with the Steel Yard to create and install a public pedestal that will encourage free speech while promoting the contributions of Roger Williams to our national philosophy.
- 2011** – City of Newport Bike Racks, 13 sculptural bike racks from salvaged anchor chain.
 - East Greenwich Library Memorial Bike Rack, A unique memorial bike rack in front of the historic library building.
 - Groundwork Garden Site Improvements, 100 feet of custom steel fencing with two marvelous towering sculptural bollards created by Rhode Island 15 – 18 year-olds in the 2011 Camp Metalhead.
- 2010** – Providence Public Housing Trash Cans, 77 trash receptacles for state subsidized housing projects in Providence, RI.
 - Woonsocket Ribbon Racks, Custom sculptural bike racks designed and installed in Woonsocket, Painted by high school students at Riverzedge Arts.
 - Olneyville and Smith Hill fences, 100 feet of custom fencing for subsidized housing in two historic providence neighborhoods.
 - Bristol Rhode Island Trash Cans, 20 traditionally crafted and hand-forged steel frames with oak whiskey barrel liners. Installed throughout Bristol, RI.
