

William Brayton: Artist Statement

William Brayton's sculpture and drawings reveal invisible forces. They show intertwined motion, suspended at a moment in time. Brayton uses chance to find new forms. Trusting this mysterious force leads to imagery that cannot be pre-conceived or repeated. Through this process, his artwork becomes a collaboration with the unseen.

William Brayton: Bio

William Brayton has exhibited extensively at the national level. His work has primarily been shown in public galleries, museums and sculpture parks including The Art Complex museum, Chesterwood, The Mount, The Brattleboro Museum, and the Hudson River Museum. He has been awarded grants from the Pollock Krasner Foundation, the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, and the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation. William Brayton is professor emeritus of art at Hampshire College where he established the sculpture program and served as Dean of the School for Interdisciplinary Arts. He lives and works in Conway Massachusetts.
