

BIOGRAPHY

Sean E Avery is a primary art teacher, author-illustrator, and designer born in South Africa; living in Perth, Western Australia. Nationally, he's best known as the creator of best-selling children's picture books, All Monkeys Love Bananas and Frank's Red Hat.

His picture book, Happy as a Hog Out of Mud, won the 2022 WAYRBA Picture Book of the Year Award and Frank's Red Hat won the 2023 CBCA Shadow Judges and WAYRBA Picture Book of the Year awards and was shortlisted for the 2023 Indie, Taco and CBCA Picture Book of the Year Award. His books have been translated into Arabic, Mandarin, French, Korean, German and Danish. Sean's new graphic novel series, Ducky the Spy, published by Walker Books Australia, is being released in April (book 1) and September (book 2) 2024.

In his previous artistic career, Sean was a sculptor who used CDs and DVDs to create breathtaking works of art that reside in galleries and private collections worldwide. His sculptures have been featured in publications like Ripleys Believe It Or Not!, The Huffington Post, and Kid's National Geographic to name a few. He represented Australia in the 2014 Waste To Art Exhibition in Baku, Azerbaijan where he built sculptures with other international artists from all around the world.

Sean currently works as the art specialist at Carnaby Rise Primary School where he has set an impressive standard for his visual art programme. His students have won many prestigious awards for creativity such as the Shaun Tan Art Award and CBCA WA Make Your Own Storybook competition. He organises annual community events, art shows and runs PD for art teachers in Metro WA. He has also established a small publishing imprint at the school that publishes one student book a year that is professionally produced and sold to raise money for the P&C.


PRESENTATIONS & WORKSHOPS

Un-bee-lievably sweet character



WALKER BOOKS

Walker Wednesday entry leads to four-book deal for WA Author

Walker Book Australia has signed a four-book deal with West Australian author Sean E Avery, after he submitted his manuscripts though Walker Wednesday in July '20. Sean's manuscripts were two out of over 1200 manuscripts submitted in the first round of Walker Wednesday, where the editorial team and other passionate staff members review unpublished manuscripts for all ages (picture books, junior fiction, middle grade fiction and YA) from new and established writers.

Walker Wednesday is now an annual event that saw nearly 3000 submissions received in 2020, from aspiring authors across Australia and New Zealand.

Perth's Sean E Avery voted CBCA's Shadow Judging Picture Book of the Year for 2023



CARNABY PRESS

Established by Carnaby Rise Primary Art teacher Sean Avery in 2019, this small publishing imprint is committed to sharing the best stories written and illustrated by Carnaby students.

Each year, the best student book is selected, professionally produced, and sold at an official book launch. The Carnaby P&C pay for printing costs and all proceeds from sales go back to the school (after the student creators receive their royalties of course).

After the initial print run, the student books go on a print-on-demand website where they can be ordered by anyone, anywhere in the world for as long as the student creators want it to remain in print.

Carnaby Press books have been bought and read by children in Australia, Brazil, Europe and the USA.

Lucy Joyce's 2021 book, *Aussie the Pool Bug*, won 2nd place in the CBCA Make Your Own Storybook competition


















LARGE GROUP PRESENTATIONS

MINI COMICS

Students are taught the conventions of comic making and graphic storytelling to create their own mini comics. They are guided through the following process:

- Character development
- Story structure and pacing
- · Comic lettering and panelling
- · Tips for self-publishing

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
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RESOURCES NEEDED:

A smart board or projector to hook up a laptop; a table to set up a laptop and drawing equipment; A4 and A3 paper; coloured paper/magazines helpful; glue sticks; textas; fineliners; coloured and lead pencils; erasers; scissors; adequate workspace for students



























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These are some of the small group workshops he offers:

COLLAGE ILLUSTRATION

Students are taught the conventions of comic making Sean uses a combination of traditional and digital collage techniques to create the illustrations for his picture books. This workshop walks kids through the process of creating a collaged landscape that could be used as a background in a book illustration:

- Painting
- Composition
- · Cutting, arranging, gluing
- Finishing details (drawing)

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These are some of the small group workshops he offers:

BOOK MAKING AND BINDING

There are many book formats students can create to showcase their stories. Sean will show students how to assemble different book styles by hand so they can best showcase their stories and drawings. He will teach students how to create the following handmade book formats:

- hard case book
- saddle-stitch book
- · hotdog fold book
- · mini comic
- · pocket (secret compartment) book
- · accordion book

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

SHINING STORIES

For students who are passionate about writing and story making already; students will be shown a number of techniques to make their stories shine in a group setting. Essentially a critique session where we will examine:

- · Writing for a specific audience
- · Creating memorable characters
- · Story Structure (rhythm, flow, variation)
- Working with words and pictures
