

Cast in Glass

OBLIQUITY, created by Moshe Bursuker, is a one-of-a-kind series of glass sculptures reflective of a moment in time where the simplicity of design and nature converge in monolithic glass castings. Hot molten glass is poured over a hand-carved tile to give the piece its visual aesthetic. Bursuker uses the encapsulating qualities of glass and a stark, high-contrast image; the glass sculpture memorizes a moment in which nature and architecture become one. Obliquity can be seen (by appointment only) at Evari Studio, in North Salem, a 1,000 square-foot showroom for architects, designers, and collectors, as well as a glass-blowing studio owned by Bursuker and his wife, Christie Silver.
