1972-79- Very early drawings exhibited on various refridgerators, spends much time painting with his

fingers, moving into thumbprints

- 1980-85- Creating various drawings: haunted houses, gallactic battles, mad scientist labs, snakes
- 1986-90- Discovers watercolor & things slowly become more complex, mostly veering from realistic studies to more surrealistic pieces. Also creates a few comic books finally selfpublishing a couple just before going to art school.
- 1994- BFA in painting from the Maine College of Art: the most interesting works of this period are a series of stamp drawings using handmade stamps
- 1994-1995- Produces many abstract collages using found paper
- 1996- March solo show at Frankie's Good Stuff- Ellsworth, Maine Later in the year landscape becomes of interest, in particular trees
- 1998- December group show at Bob Gotlieb Artspace- Bar Harbor, Maine
- Landscapes begin to progress and become the primary focus
- 2000- March solo show at the Blue Hill Co-op- Blue Hill, Maine
- 2001- October solo show at The Grand Ellsworth, Maine
 - Begins a series of drawings based on the concept of Folly
- 2002- The idea of clouds and light starts to take focus as primary subject matter
- 2004- May solo show at the Blue Hill Co-op- Blue Hill, Maine

2005- Summer Group shows at the Wingspread Gallery in Northeast Harbor, Maine and at the Blue Hill Public Library- Blue Hill, Maine

2006- March- 2 day, 3 person show at Nasset Designs- Blue Hill, Maine as well as the Summer group show at the Blue Hill Public Library, August solo show at Max's Art, & September solo show at the Blue Hill Public Library- all Blue Hill, Maine

Waterfalls start to become primary subject matter

- 2007- January two person show MERI Center, June solo show of waterfalls at Max's Art, & Summer Group Show at the Blue Hill Public Library- all Blue Hill, Maine; also a couple of paintings go on display at the Turtle Gallery Deer Isle, Maine
