I make abstract paintings which were formed by a lifelong investigation into color relationships and the potential energy stored in human gesture. For me painting is a method of communication.

I learned traditional Sumi ink calligraphy. From these lessons I developed a more fluid method of brushwork that is a common technique in contemporary calligraphy, yet it is rarely applied to discipline of acrylic painting. Incorporating this approach into my painting practice has given the work a unique energy. I also studied under second generation abstract expressionist Kikuo Saito, who strongly effected the way I approach color relationships. My paintings are thick with many built up layers. A careful application of paint application creates a push pull effect, that draws in the viewer. A successful painting has the perfect blend of harmony and discord created by the delicate balance and conflict in between the color and brushwork employed. This duality reflects one's experience in life.

Passionate about creativity and artistry, my professional journey has been guided by a profound love for the creation process. Commencing with a degree in Graphic Design and Typography from the Art University in Tokyo, I embarked on a career path that melded my artistic inclinations with professional expertise. In 1994, at 43, I embarked on a transformative journey to New York, seeking new avenues for personal and professional growth.
