- 2021- **Rural Ecosystem Toolkit with Beau Kenyon**. I've partnered with Beau Kenyon, a composer of multimedia installations, immersive public performances, and staged interdisciplinary works, to create *The Arts Toolkit for Cross-institutional Partnerships* (tentative title) to provide guidance and resources to rural communities throughout Iowa. In 2021, we visited 6 rural Iowa communities that are achieving unique vibrancy and community- centered arts leadership. This document will be free and available online at the ISU Extension Store and the Oakley Collective for Arts + Research website.
- 2020- **Rural Shrink Smart: Rural Iowa.** I am a Faculty Associate in an interdisciplinary team exploring smart population shrinkage in rural communities with a \$1.5 million grant from the National Science

Foundation. This proposal examines how increasing social capital in rural lowa communities can mitigate the effects of current population shrinkage and prevent future decline. For the next three years, I will be working collaboratively to create curriculum about smart shrinkage to implement in our partner communities. In 2022 and 2023, I will design my DSN 546 option studio to test these creative approaches for increasing and measuring social capital within these communities - the data of which will be disseminated on a larger scale.

- 2019-21 **We the Many: Arts on the Prairie, Perry, Iowa.** I serve as a consultant for Arts on the Prairie in envisioning and designing for *We the Many* in Perry. *We the Many* is an Arts Midwest pilot program to build yearlong performing arts residencies placing underrepresented Midwestern artists or artistic ensembles in three small or rural Midwestern communities. My contributions resulted in connecting with Iowa performance poet Akwi Nji to serve as project cultural advisor, developing a cohesive community mission for the project, and in focusing on a community asset mapping framework for the project.
- 2019-20 **#WomenKnowStuffToo: Ames, Iowa.** I served as a community engagement consultant to help develop off-campus programming for the *#WomenKnowStuffToo* exhibition at the ReAct Gallery at Iowa State University.
