Serio is Professor of Painting at The University of Texas at Tyler where she has taught since 2004. Selected accomplishments include being a finalist for the prestigious Hunting Art Prize (Houston, Texas), completing an artist residency at The Gullkistan International Residency for Creative People (Laugvartn, Iceland) and participating in an international group exhibition at The Tokyo Metropolitan Art Museum (Tokyo, Japan). Serio has an extensive national and international exhibition record and is currently represented by The Drawing Room (Cos Cob, Connecticut) and Edgewater Gallery (Middlebury, Vermont).
