Ancestral Foods: Family Feasts, Bronx Art Space, Curator, 2023

An exhibition exploring ancestral foods whether as a soothing balm, an act of resistance, or a call to action the artists recall and imbed their family's food history into their practice, reclaiming and reinterpreting for their modern sensibilities. Artists' interpretations of food are memorials to their lineage elucidating the lessons from these rich sensory food encounters bound to family, culture, ritual, ancestry, and identity.

Geographies of The Self, Longwood Art Gallery at Hostos, BCA, Bronx, NY, Curator, 2022

This exhibition focused on how the imagery of the human form connects to an individual's ancestry, and how artists grapple with communities in diaspora. Ritual and tradition are recontextualized with the artist's own experience and interpretations for personal and communal relevancy. The imprint of colonization, slavery, and genocide are ever-present in bodies and landscapes. The artists here interpret new reclamations of healing and empowerment and embrace a future that is informed by its history and re-imagines utopian futures.

Beasts Like Me: Feminism and Fantasy, Bronx Art Space, Curator, 2020

Presented as part of the Feminist Art Coalition initiative to highlight feminist practices in the arts in the run-up to the presidential election in the Fall of 2020. Proposed, designed, and curated this exhibition that investigated animals, anthropomorphism, and the dance between representations of self and animalistic notions. Bodies morph and undergo transformation, part human and part beast in subversive fictionalized imagery. The works elucidate the transformative effect of fantasy, revealing mythical imagery of animals, and imagined beasts in a new light of empowerment.

Listen: Artists Respond to Politics, Bronx Arts Space, Curator, 2019

The exhibition explored the diversity of responses among 13 cis and trans women and gender non-conforming artists to our current political times and the #MeToo movement. Political upheaval forces society to name the wrong, to define oneself, to advocate for the rights of ourselves and others, and to respond to the oppression of all marginalized groups. The artists explore social, political, and gender constructs and how they play a part in sexual harassment, assault, and the emergence of the #MeToo movement. Asking questions, like is there a direct correlation between how one is depicted and how they are treated? How are sexualized depictions of women in the media contributing to sexual assault? How are trans women and gender non-conforming persons represented in the media? Visitors were asked to listen and respond with their reactions, ideas, and plans for confronting these issues.
