#### FUNDING & FACILITIES IMPROVEMENTS

#### 2019-2022 Multi-Phase Lab Overhaul

Following my evaluation, planning and re-visioning of the facilities, the Printmaking Area saw a multi-phase overhaul. This was made possible with the aid and support of Department Chair Joe Peragine, funding from the Welch School of Art &

Design and COTA. This overhaul included:

Implementation of a multi-phase, \$150,000 overhaul of HVAC and ventilation in the printmaking classrooms; the introduction of 7 fume extraction arms; major press repair; replacement of obsolete equipment; procuring of a professional rosin box, new large-format hot plate, and screen drying storage solutions.

Annexation of Room 455, to create a darkroom for photo processes and silkscreen.

Initiation of ongoing improvements to equipment, workflow, and organization of the lab for ADA compliance, health and safety considerations, and to adapt the workspaces to better suit current teaching styles and methods.

Elimination of unhealthy materials, hazardous chemicals and obsolete supplies in favor of safer, less toxic and more economical alternatives. Streamlining of the consumables supply inventory.

Traveled to conduct Field research to SCAD, UGA, and Tamarind Institute in New Mexico to study their lab layouts and organization, health and safety arrangements, signage, tools, and material usage for inspiration and ideas that could be implemented in our own space and to see if we are in consensus with general best practices.

#### 2019-2021 Grant Proposal: Student Tech Fee (Granted 75%: \$15,000)

Wrote and successfully concluded a technology grant to bring a digital workstation, Apple computer, large-format scanner, printer, and Apple TV into the classroom to aid with digital and post-digital approaches to printmaking and to allow for ease of accessibility and inclusion of audio-visual learning.
