"'No Way To Prevent This,' Says Only Nation Where This Regularly Happens"-The Onion There is seldom a time where I would quote The Onion to make an intro for something that is as heavy of a subject as mass shootings in the United States. But when first reading this right after one of the many shootings in recent years, it stuck with me. How was a satirical paper speaking more truth about what is occurring while many of our politicians keep putting their hands up and sweeping their responsibility under the rug? Why was it that our politicians were more often sending "thoughts and prayers" instead of taking the appropriate action? Why are the leaders of our country saying that there is nothing that can be done?

The idea for this show began in August after the two mass shootings in El Paso and Dayton. However, in addition to the ongoing mass shootings, we know that gun violence in the U.S. includes and extends beyond these, encompassing many types of violent crime, unwarranted killings by law enforcement, and suicide. There are the behind the scenes, or not so hidden, causes of gun violence in the U.S.- mental health issues, domestic violence, social constructs, racism, homophobia, and political rhetoric. How do we come together as a nation to create healing and change? Although it's not possible to address all of these issues within one show, this exhibition is an effort to as address some portion of these issues through our work by supporting others that are organizing larger efforts in amending gun legislature, and by prompting further conversation.
