





## **Jacqueline Livingston**


Excerpt from Artist Statement in the Artifacts catalog, 1981: "Male nudity still causes hysterical uneasiness in America, and so we are robbed of many images of men. When my son, Sam, was 6, he was looking through my collection of photo and art books, which almost exclusively show female nudes. He said, 'But where am I?'"

**LIVINGSTON BECAME ONE** of the first targets of the newly created child pornography legislation that took effect in the late seventies. Not only did Livingston lose her job at Cornell University, but Kodak confiscating some of her films, saying they were "pornography." Several art magazines refused to run ads for Livingston's posters of male nudes. She sued the University for firing her, alleging sex-biased employment discrimination. After five years of litigation the case resulted in a settlement; however Livingston was never again allowed to teach at Cornell. She opened One-Artist's Gallery in New York, but due to continuing surveillance by the FBI, she was forced to close.

In a recent interview, Steven Watson stated that despite the backlash Jacqueline suffered, there was no public reaction against Steven and Carol as producers and distributors of this work when it was included in *Artifacts*.

**DUE TO THE CONTROVERSIAL** subject matter contained in this work, the UMCA, in its role as a public museum embedded in an educational institution, has decided not to display the work as viewable. We ask you to consider these questions:

- A. Would exhibiting this piece victimize the person depicted here as a child?
- B. Did Livingston's status as the child's mother and as a female artist influence the public's reaction to these images?
- C. What is the role of the educational art museum in relation to freedom of speech and censorship of art works?
- D. What kind of world might enable this work to be exhibited without controversy?




