

Marion Webber ~ Artist Biography

Artist's Statement-

“Nature is Nurture. My art is a visceral connection to nature balancing exploratory freedom with craftsmanship. I seek out unusual views whether broad vistas or intimate spaces. My desire is to make the ordinary ~ extraordinary.”

Introduction

I was born in Oakville, Ontario, Canada, and was privy to my mother's painting style early on. My mother was influenced by the Group of Seven, especially Tom Thompson who was a personal friend of the family, particularly her father, Dr. Alexander Pirie.

My grandmother was an avid art collector, buying well known Canadian and European artists including Turner, Rembrandt, Cornelius Krieghoff and Paul Peel. So, at a young age, I was exposed to excellent art.

I received a BFA in 1975 from the University of Victoria. I studied drawing, painting and conceptual thinking. I also embraced black and white photography. This period allowed me to understand the differing approaches to creativity. Photography captures and edits an image to communicate a story. Painting selects and combines elements and builds the story. This combination pervades my work. The gestation period for a painting series can be long, from 2 to 10 years.

Continuous Learning

After university I worked for a photography store in Victoria, BC and a magazine/newspaper publisher (1976-77, Yellowknife, NWT). I moved down to Edmonton, Alta. and worked in the publishing industry for a few years. I went back to school, acquiring a degree in graphics and advertising from Grant MacEwan Community College, 1979. This deepened my design acumen greatly.

In 1982 I made the first of several trips to Europe. I visited over 50 galleries and museums. Many left an indelible impression on me. I fondly remember going to the British Museum, Tate, Prado, Louvre, Jeu de Paume and the Alte Pinakothek as if it was yesterday. The first time I saw one of Rembrandt's self-portraits, I was stunned. I could feel

what he was feeling as an aging man. And Turner, wow! His later painting style was so avant-garde and abstract. It's no wonder 19th-20th century artists such as Claude Monet were influenced by Turner and started the Impressionist movement.

I moved to Vancouver in 1983, and worked in the graphics industry. After 25 years as a designer, then 10 years as a marketing management consultant, I went back to my first love... painting. Since 1998, I've been creating many works in oil pastel, graphite, acrylics, ink, and oils. I have taught fine and applied art students and continue to conduct workshops. I believe that it's easy to paint, but difficult to paint well. Therefore I teach my students to build skills.

A Lifetime in Art

I pay homage to a range of great deceased masters: da Vinci, Rembrandt, Caravaggio, Constable, Monet, Turner, Gorky, Diebenkorn, Rothko, Kahn, Smith and so many more. Living masters, I admire include, Jeremy Mann, Alex Kanevsky, Cecily Brown and Ann Gale.

Since 2012, my newer work is more of an inner journey of impressions and feelings in the guise of nature. The work is more visceral and abstract. Again, these new series take time to gestate, born from years of skill building and acquiring many visual memories.

I cannot give what I do not have, therefore I give what I am, and that's the gift. My hope is to give solace to viewers, a place of rest and nurturance. I also want viewers to notice simple scenarios in nature and treat it with more respect.
