

Guzzo—an internationally performed composer and professor at the University of Wyoming—is passionate about new music. She founded and directs the Wyoming Festival in Grand Teton National Park. Her music has been heard on National Public Radio's "Performance Today" and has been played by the AdZel Duo, Voices of Change, the Colorado Chamber Orchestra, Allégresse trio, the Empyrean Ensemble, the Divan Consort, Third Angle, and many others.

He earned a BS in biology and a PhD in entomology. He worked for 17 years as an insect ecologist at the University of Wyoming. In 2003, he metamorphosed into a Professor of Natural Sciences & Humanities in the departments of philosophy and creative writing. His writing has been honored with a Pushcart Prize, the John Burroughs award, and inclusion in the Best American Science and Nature Writing.

Swiss-American **Thomas A. Blomster** has a BMus from Metropolitan State College of Denver and an MA from the University of Denver and he is the Music Director of the Colorado Chamber Orchestra. He has performed and studied throughout North America, Europe, and New Zealand. Blomster has worked with Aaron Copland ("the Dean of American Composers"), Krzysztof Penderecki (Poland's greatest, living composer), and Karel Husa (Pulitzer Prize winner for Music) as well as members of the New York Philharmonic, Philadelphia Orchestra, and the San Francisco Symphony. He has performed or conducted with several orchestras, including Theatre des Westens (Berlin), Orquesta Sinfonica de Mineria (Mexico City), and the Colorado Symphony Orchestra (Denver). Recently Maestro Blomster was awarded the Order of the Polar Star by the President of Mongolia.

#### Armando Conreras

Praised for "the easy caramel syrup of his voice" (Opera Today), Mexican-American baritone Armando Contreras is quickly becoming a standout in the world of opera. In the 2020/2021 season, Mr. Contreras was seen as Ernesto in the US premiere of Bizet's Don Procopio with Pacific Opera Project, Il Conte in Le nozze di Figaro and Marcello in La bohème with Boulder Opera, and Diego Rivera in Frida and the Bravest Girl in the World with Opera Steamboat.

In the summer of 2021, he covered the role of Papageno in Mozart's The Magic Flute with The Glimmerglass Festival. In 2021, Mr. Contreras was a part of the world premiere of Aleksandra Vrebalov and Deborah Breevort's The Knock, singing the lead role Lt. Roberto Gonzales with The Glimmerglass Festival. Other highlights of his current season include his debut with Salt Marsh Opera as Moralès in Carmen, reprising the role of Diego Rivera in Frida and the Bravest Girl in the World with Central City Opera, joining Opera Steamboat in The Three Feathers as The King/Rat and making his Denver Philharmonic debut in L'elisir d'amore as Belcore.


This summer, Mr. Contreras will return to The Glimmerglass Festival to sing a lead role in the world premiere of the Rossini pastiche, Tenor Overboard, and cover Moralès in Carmen. In 2022-2023, Mr. Contreras will sing Marco in Gianni Schicchi and Council in Trial by Jury with Salt Marsh Opera. He will also make his company debut with Cincinnati Opera in the near future.



#### Nathan Snyder

Mr. Snyder sets himself apart with his energetic performances, commanding stage presence, and attentive musicianship. Praised for his "lovely" portrayal of Fenton in The Merry Wives of Windsor, and hailed as "riveting" in his performance of Don Jose in Carmen, Mr. Snyder attentively molds the music and characters together throughout the opera repertoire. Recently Mr. Snyder performed with Opera Kansas as Frederic in a sold-out production of Pirates of Penzance.

Amidst the pandemic, Mr. Snyder was able to perform in adaptive formats the role of Rodolfo in Puccini's masterpiece La Bohème with Boulder Opera and Rodgers & Hammerstein's Jubilee with Loveland Opera Theatre. Mr. Snyder has finally returned to the stage and is in the midst of a season of firsts, including Trouble in Tahiti with Opera Fort Collins, then singing William Royle, JB Turner, and Dewey Noyes in the world premiere of Staggerwing with Opera Kansas, Prince Charming in Cendrillon by Pauline Viardot with Loveland Opera Theatre, and Manrico in Verdi's Il Trovatore with Boulder Opera.
