The Sonia Shankman Orthogenic School is a therapeutic residential and day school program for children with profound emotional and behavioral issues or who are on the autism scale. The school followed a milieu treatment therapeutic approach in which all classes and activities are viewed as being therapeutic opportunities to help each student grow and fulfill their potential.

I co-taught seven classes a day five days a week, four of which I was the lead teacher. The curriculum for my classes (two painting and drawing classes, middle school art, as well as literary magazine) were focused on teaching important art and history concepts, as well as building confidence in my students as artists and individuals.
