# KRISTA STOVEL

Krista Stovel is a Canadian photographer and mix media artist. Having lived and worked in Japan and Australia she has been influenced by the elegance of the traditional Japanese ceramics and textiles and the colourful irreverence of the Australian aesthetic. She has developed a unique body of work focusing on mundane objects such as a pile of mah-jong counting sticks and a bare mattress in an empty room. By transferring her photographs onto old metal and wood surfaces she creates an intimacy and an underlying sense of longing that draws the viewer in.

In 2017 she curated a show and exhibited her first installation and collaboration entitled *Morphogenic*, an 8  $\times$  12 living room wallpapered with her photographs which explored the patterns unique to her life. She collaborated with her 16-year-old son Tettey Tetteh (who performs under the name Leno TK) and who created a soundscape based on his own interpretation of her life as a visual artist.

She is a Certified Art Therapist and Registered Clinical Counsellor.
