This one-month-plus artist residency introduced printmaking, collaborative art-making, a lunchtime art club, and exhibition of works, to the approximately 600 students at the school. Two-week Artist Residency in the printmaking studios of the Faculty of Critical and Creative Studies at the invitation of Professor Briar Craig. Self-guided experiments in monotype and zinc etching, alongside field research.
