Responsibilities:

Overseeing all facets of the operation of the School of Art and Design and the Zuckerman Museum of Art, including: effective leadership, recruitment and development of faculty; support of curricular and program enhancement; advocacy of the School of Art within the University and externally; management of personnel, facilities, and budget.

Initiatives:

1. Strategic Planning and Priorities

- a) Increased enrollment in the Kennesaw State University School of Art and Design. July 2014 enrollment was approximately 350 students. Enrollment for Fall 2023 was 1300 students.. This increase is the result of the introduction of new programs focused on the Design Arts and technology, utilizing data from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, suggesting regional demographic needs for specific disciplines.
- b) Created new areas of focus for the Bachelor of Fine Arts program to drive growth. Developed a stand alone BFA major in Digital Animation, which was approved by the Georgia Board of Regents in November, 2016. Anticipated 50 majors by year 3 of the program; current enrollment stands at 437 students.
- c) In addition to Digital Animation, new concentrations in both Illustration and Comics & Sequential Arts were introduced. Bureau of Labor Statistics states that Georgia is 6th in the country in employment of animators. In May 2022, there were 1070 animators in Georgia with an hourly mean wage of \$36.11 and an annual mean wage of \$75,120.00. Illustration and Sequential Art are supportive disciplines to Animation and Game Design. *Animation Career Review* magazine ranked our Illustration program 4th best in the south in our 3rd year of offering the program, the only public university in the top 4. The Comics & Sequential Art program is the only concentration at a public university in the country.
- d) The KSU Apparel Textiles and Technology program was migrated from the College of Engineering Technology to the School of Art and Design in late 2017. The program has been redesigned to fit within the framework of *NASAD* (National Association of Schools of Art and Design) degree requirements and competencies. Rebranded as Textile and Surface Design, the curriculum has been redesigned to fit the needs of the region's Carpet, Flooring and Textiles industries. The program has two tracks: Design and Business. The School of Art and Design has collaborated with Kennesaw State University's Coles College of Business to deliver the Business track. With the redesign, enrollment has increased from 47 students in Spring 2018 to 110

in Fall 2019. The Atlanta region ranks 7th in the country for employment of designers for textiles and fashion. The annual mean salary is \$72,010.00.

- e) In 2019, Kennesaw State University's *Zuckerman Museum of Art* was moved from the KSU Department of Museums, Archives and Rare Books to the School of Art and Design. The museum provides the performative mission for the school by providing art historical scholarship, education, and exhibitions of work by local, regional, national and international artists as well as student capstone programming. The museum's focus is in supporting the educational mission of the school and university, fostering intellectual inquiry into the connections between art and contemporary life and engaging audiences on campus and in our community.
- f) Introduced the *Master Craftsman Program*. Working with business partners in the Atlanta community, students design functional public art that is commissioned and permanently installed. The program is designed to provide students experience in project management from concept through implementation. Students present concepts, write business plans, prepare and negotiate budgets with external clients. The program is highly successful, with projects completed for the cities of Kennesaw, Marietta, Acworth and Cobb County, Georgia.
- g) Developed an MA in Art and Design, with three tracks: Digital Animation, Art Education and Museum Studies. This is the first graduate degree within the KSU College of the Arts. It is a degree that focuses pedagogically on both technology and workforce development. A common core supports the first year of study, utilizes technology in Art and Design, and engages in rigorous examination of creativity and professional practice. The program is designed to add tracks, providing growth for creation of cross campus collaborative concentrations. Current graduate enrollment is 80 students.
- h) School of Art and Design successfully went through NASAD reaccreditation in 2018. The MA in Art and Design degree was accredited by NASAD in 2023.
- i) Created an articulation agreement with ESA St. Luc in Brussels, Belgium. With one of the best design, illustration and sequential art programs in Europe, we actively engage in workshops, student and faculty exchanges.
- j) Developed DEI (Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion) Mini-Grants within the School of Art and Design. Dedicated \$6000.00 to grants awarded at \$250.00 each to support educational programming focused on DEI initiatives within the School of Art and Design.

2. *Fiscal and Resource Management*

- a) For transparency, the entire college budget and the budgeting process were opened. All budget data for the college and departments are shared with all departments. Requests from departments for new funding and renovations are shared openly with all departments, and a process that involves feedback from faculty and administrators is used to finalize the priorities for resource allocation.
- b) Financial support for the School of Art and Design's technology-based Design Arts programming (Digital Animation, Illustration, Sequential Arts, Textile and Surface design) has been generous. All requests for technology funding follow presented

- rationale that defines need based on student enrollment and demand, industry utilization and regional workforce data gathered from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. Because our Design Arts programming is focused on technology and workforce development, we have been supported. Four new design studios have been funded since 2017, each seating 20 students. Each studio is equipped with high-end iMac Pros and PC's, specifically designed for 3D Animation and Textile Design. \$160,000.00 was spent for Cintiq monitors for each studio.
- c) Two new digital studios are being created this summer to manage the growth of the Digital Animation and Graphic Communications programs. One studio will be mac-based, the other PC. 40 new computers and new Cintiq monitors have been ordered. These studios will also accommodate the graduate students in the Digital Animation track of the new MA in Art and Design.
 - d) 21,000 square feet of studio space is currently under construction to accommodate new studios for Drawing, Painting and Printmaking. The new studios will be completed by the middle of spring 2020, with occupancy for the fall, 2020 semester.
 - e) 2023 construction of 20,000 square feet of space to accommodate studios for Illustration, Comics & Sequential Art, Digital Animation, Graphic Communications, 2D Design, Art History, as well as our Digital Maker Space. Funding has been approved for the next phase of construction set for 2024; studios for Photography & Video, 3D Design, Digital Animation, Graphic Communications, and Art Education.
 - f) In 2023, secured \$1,000,000.00 for the Zuckerman Museum of Art to construct a 7000 square foot student gallery to support capstone exhibitions, experimental exhibitions proposed by students, faculty and staff, visiting artists' workshops, and to support rotating exhibitions of the Southern Graphics Council Print collection, archived at the Zuckerman Museum of Art.
