

Kim Rhoney Workshop Supply List

1. The Paint! This is the most important part and many folks think that they can substitute any oil paint that they have on hand or that they will get better results if they upgrade the quality of the paint. That works in brush painting, but we need paint with a heavier body which means “fillers”. Paint that is thicker is undesirable for brush painting, but we love this with knives. Especially when we are learning!

Please only purchase Winsor & Newton “Winton Oil Colour” brand paints. Hues are fine, we do not need pure pigments for this method of painting. Here is a list of colors:

Titanium White
Cadmium Yellow Pale Hue
Cadmium Yellow Hue
Cadmium Red Hue
Alizron Crimson Red
Cerulean Blue Hue
Ultramarine Blue
Magenta
Sap Green
Veridian Hue

2. Color Pencils – any color will do, I usually use red or cerulean blue. Graphite smears, so make sure to bring a colored pencil to layout your paintings.

2. Medium:

You will not need any solvents for this class. They are allowed in the studio we are using, but my painting method does not require them. You may bring Cold Wax Medium to add to your paint. This will give your paint more body, a shorter setting time and the paint will dry to a matte finish. Adding wax can be an awkward step for a beginner. Therefore, this product is “optional”.

3. Knives:

I have over 30 knives that I have collected over the years. Here are to that I would like you to have to start:

Loew Cornell J-12
Loew Cornell J-15

4. Painting Supports (surfaces):

Canvas Panels (you will need 4 to 5)

1 - 8" x 10"

2 - 9" x 12"

2 - 11" x 14"

5. Miscellaneous supplies:

Paper towel

An old phone book to blot and wipe your knives

A section of newspaper to put under your work to protect the table

Table top easel (If you have one bring it, if not you can tilt your work up by using a piece of old 2" x 4", or 1" x 3" piece of wood. A one foot piece would be enough to tilt your work up off the table.

6. Art Journal or Notebook – write reminders if you like!

7. How to travel with wet paintings: save your pizza boxes, they will save your car!
