

Kim Rhoney Workshop Supply List 2018

1. The Paint! This is the most important part and many folks think that they can substitute any oil paint that they have on hand or that they will get better results if they upgrade the quality of the paint. That works in brush painting, but we need paint with a heavier body which means “fillers”. Paint that is thicker is undesirable for brush painting, but we love this with knives. Especially when we are learning!

Please only purchase Winsor & Newton “Winton Oil Colour” brand paints. Hues are fine, we do not need pure pigments for this method of painting. Purchasing your colors in a hue will help keep the price down. Here is a list of suggested colors:

Titanium White
Cadmium Yellow Pale Hue
Cadmium Yellow Hue
Cadmium Red Hue
Alizron Crimson Red
Cerulean Blue Hue
Ultramarine Blue
Magenta
Sap Green
Veridian Hue

2. Color Pencils – one or two of any color will do, I usually use red or cerulean blue. Graphite smears, so make sure to bring a colored pencil to layout your paintings.
2. Medium:
You will not need any solvents for this class. My painting method does not require them. You may bring Cold Wax Medium (strongly suggest Gamblin brand here) to add to your paint. This will give your paint more body, a shorter setting time and the paint will dry to a matte finish. Adding wax can be an awkward and complicating step for a beginner. Therefore, this product is “optional”.
3. Knives:
I have over 30 knives that I have collected over the years. Here are to that I would like you to have to start:
Loew Cornell J-12
Loew Cornell J-15
These are not always easy to find. I have the most success at www.brushesandmore.com

4. Painting Supports (surfaces):
Canvas Panels or stretched Canvas – plan on at least one 16” x 20” or two small canvases. Anything larger will be hard to finish within the time of the workshop.
