



Ilona Pachler is an artist working with images derived from photos and screen printed onto various substrates as well as working with sculptural elements. In her current practice she addresses the memory of place and the immeasurability of memory.

In fabricating sculptures that attempt to measure these memories of time and distance, she creates sculptural devices, that - in combination with the image - are forming new places and a new visual syntax.

She was born in Austria and is currently living in Santa Fe NM, she studied in Vienna and received her MFA in painting and textile arts graduating at the University of Art in Linz Austria.

Her work has been exhibited in Europe, Japan and the USA and is represented in collections of the Upper Austrian Ministry of Culture and Education as well as corporate and private collections in the US and abroad.

She was the recipient of a residency/ fellowship at the Villa Stoneborough-Wittgenstein in 2015 in Gmunden Austria and exhibited her resulting work at the Museum of Fine Arts in Santa Fe NM Alcove show in 2017.
