


Pet Portrait Commissions

I ask for a 25% booking fee to secure your portrait space, with the full balance due on completion.

I retain the copyright to all works commissioned by the client. No artwork may be reproduced or altered without my written consent. I will not produce prints of your artwork to be sold, however they may be used for display or promotional purposes.

Packaging and Shipping:

Pieces will be carefully packaged and shipped priority with tracking info and insurance. Postage, package and handling starts from \$15.00 for US. Please enquire for overseas shipping. Full payment must be paid before I ship the artwork. I will provide the client with tracking details. Payment of import duty may be liable in some countries, which is the sole responsibility of the client.

Photography Tips!

Where possible, I work from good quality, digital photos, and I am happy to receive as many as you'd like to send. We will work together to choose the best one for the portrait. I understand that many portraits are memorials, and I will work from poor quality photos where higher quality pictures aren't available, but please understand that your portrait may be slightly less detailed.

- It is best to use a camera so as much detail can be picked up as possible. Camera phones are not ideal unless it is one with great specs!
- Take photos of your animal outside in natural light.
- Try to get on your pet's eye level and make sure that the picture is fully in focus and there isn't a 'flash' in their eyes.
- Make sure you send the photos over in their original format (so don't crop or edit the photos) as this can decrease the size and resolution of the image.

Ultimately the decision is yours on what pose/look you want from your animal as you know that certain personality they have and what portrays them best!

Here are some good examples:
