Nancy Halbrooks' work has shown most recently at Artists Archive of the Western Reserve's LGBTQ show and at Lorain County Community College's 2021 Faculty Show in the Beth K. Stocker Art Gallery. Her work has been shown throughout the country. Many of her large pastels and prints are in the Public Per Cent for Art Collection in the State of Washington.

She has BFA in Painting from Indiana University and MFA in Painting from the University of Washington. She has worked primarily in two-dimensional mediums such as painting, printmaking and drawing. Since retirement she has focused on book art or paper art media. The work in this exhibit reflects new directions including work in French Cartonnage, a three-dimensional medium of box making.
