

CURRENT 2018 BIOGRAPHY OF DIANE LA FONTAINE

Diane La Fontaine was born in Matane, Quebec, Canada and raised in Chicago, Illinois. Her art training began in high school at the Art Institute of Chicago, studying anatomy and composition. She then attended the Art Students League of New York City for four years with various scholarships. With her early love of abstract paintings, she focused her studies at the League with the renowned teacher, Vaclav Vitylacil and print maker, Seong Moy. Both artists studied with the Hans Hoffman School. Diane also studied with Roberto De Lamonica and Michael Ponce de Leon for traditional and contemporary methods of printmaking.

Her desire for adventure and new inspirations, lead her to the West Coast where she then moved to Vancouver, British Columbia and became part of the growing 1980's art scene. After five years, she moved to Galiano Island, a small, rural island between Vancouver and Victoria, British Columbia and made it her home base for 17 years. It was during this time that Diane first explored the raw untouched beauty of the West Coast in her work. Here she has developed a significant body of work inspired by the island's natural beauty, working in plein air to study the landscape and its natural forms in oil pastels and oils. Diane later discovered her plaster based mixed medium method and decided to further her exploration by studying sculpture, ceramics and conceptual art at the Emily Carr School of Fine Art. She traveled for long periods of time to new vistas and cultures, to stimulate diversity of her expression in the creative process.

In 2002 Diane moved to Maui, Hawaii. She continued with her landscape inspired artwork and created a wide variety of artistic expressions executed in series, using various applications of mixed mediums over the ensuing years. She left Maui in the summer of 2012. Diane then traveled for 4 years across the USA and Canada, creating art directly influenced by the environment in which she resided. Diane returned to her beloved Maui in 2017 where she now resides full time.
