# JULIE 'Jules' MCNIEL: the Personal Biography of an OG Artist

Born in San Francisco in the '60s, she grew up immersed in a vibrant, culturally diverse street scene, resonant with music and dance. Her friends came from all over the world. Jule's classmates were Chinese, Sicilian, Navajo, African-American, Mesoamerican, Irish. Jules learned early to find sustenance in ink drawing, oil painting, clay sculpture, and made handmade books out of found materials. Jules started hustling early as a teaching artist, showing other kids in her neighborhood how to draw and sell cartoons, while still in elementary school.

Jules had a passion for ecology and the natural world. In the 1960s and 70s, she roamed the redwoods along the slopes of Mt. Tamalpais (a Miwok name) and was awe-struck by the beauty of the sea urchin shells she picked up on Ocean Beach. She joined the feminist movement in her teens. In the 1980s she made 'zines with other young artists in San Francisco and Oakland that addressed homelessness and under-paid labor. Jules drew patrons and volunteered at the Glide Memorial Church soup kitchen. She worked as a freelance illustrator for the Philippine Drug Intervention Project. She visited San Francisco Jail as an artist-journalist. Jules collaborated in creating a quilt with the AIDs Quilt Project, after the death of a college friend. She then made her first trip to China in 1987, resulting in a series of award-winning experimental illustrations.

She was involved in the San Francisco Mission School in the '90s, now considered the forerunner of the *urban rustic* art movement. The 1980s-90s was a time when

she realized how powerful the intersection between the arts, culture, and activism could be.

Today, and over the past 2 decades, Jules works as an artist in far northern California. She has taught university and community arts classes, including youth and elders programs. Jules also provided art workshops for eight years as a Site Coordinator and Teaching Artist at Pelican Bay State Prison. As an artist-entrepreneur, Jules has provided tutoring/ mentoring services, and exhibited her paintings, etchings and hand-drawn animated films in galleries and museums.

She is currently designing a series of workshops that integrate circles, meditation, creative visualization exercises, with visual arts practices. She is working on a comics book project.

She is a member of the Humboldt Bay Mycological Society and the California Native Plant Society. Jules has a loving Life Partner of 40 years - an accomplished Taiko drummer and Sensei. They have a beloved adopted daughter who is passionate about social justice issues, and the art of crochet.
