### INTRODUCTION TO DRAWING with Rachel Reynolds Z

#### INTRODUCTION TO PAINTING

### with Rachel Reynolds Z

This course includes instruction on mixing a palette, building a composition, locating values and application techniques. Projects include painting still lives from observation, describing metallic and glass surfaces, painting natural or urban landscapes, exploring magnification and cropping, experimenting with distortion, abstraction and mixed-media.

The course includes 6 lessons. <u>It is recommended to engage with each lesson in sequential order, as each class builds on lessons learned in the previous class.</u> However, the lessons are numbered, and individual non-sequential lessons may be purchased at student request.

- *Intro to Palette Mixing* covers how to mix a monochromatic palette, using one color to mix 15 versions of value and temperature. This also includes basic information about manipulating paint and washing brushes. (Lesson 1)
- *Project 1* focus is on identifying value and infusing warms and cools to achieve the illusion of dimension. (Lesson 2)
- Project 2 focus is on painting reflective surfaces such as metallic, glass or mirror. (Lesson 3)
- *Project 3* focus is on painting a scene with deeper space, such as landscapes in nature, urban landscapes or interior spaces. (Lesson 4)
- *Project 4* focus is to zoom-in and crop, serving as an introduction into abstraction. (Lesson 5)
- **Project 5 & 6** are taught simultaneously and focus on abstraction, distortion, experimentation and application approaches. (Lesson 6)
