Each sculpture is gathered from the beautiful west coast of British Columbia, Canada, stored, dried and honed while the artist 'listens' to and discovers the wood guiding him, evolving into works of a multiplicity of life forms. Each piece reveals unending discoveries of creatures emerging, forms drifting into each other, life encompassing life. Kostadinos' masterful combination of bronze and driftwood art reflects the complex and rich nature of his passionate spirit. Born in Greece, he moved to Canada, creating through his Greek Mythological heritage, feeling a passionate kindness and treasured role of caring for the fallen wood that drifts upon the sea onto our shores.

"A tree is a living thriving thing from Mother Earth and goes on living even when it has been cut down and left forgotten, overlooked, floating in the womb of the oceans for hundreds of years.

It once stood to give us all life, just as it has a life of it's own, until it fell by grace or by force, traveling throughout time to find it's way back to new life in the hands of those who listen, who care. The messages are there for each of us.

The trees have been here long before we were and they're only a few strands of DNA different than we as humans are. The fallen whose limbs need to be mended, whose ability to transform are as limitless as our own.
