In this class we will learn about all aspects of decals including;

- How to get great results with kiln-fired enamels
- Alternative techniques for manipulating decals
- Options for color
- How to prepare photo for best outcome
- Torch fired with decals
- Troubleshooting
- Finishing

What you will need

- Basic enameling knowledge
- An HP or Canon laser black and white printer {see list below}
- Decal paper at http://fired-on.com/fired-images-glass-distributors

Format: This is a self-directed class designed to maximize online capabilities. I will provide:

- A detailed step-by-step instruction booklet that can be printed out and used as a handout.
- I will share many of my personal discoveries with detailed descriptions of the process.
- Each student works at their own pace and all questions to me will be answered in a prompt, timely manner.
- We will also have a private group on Facebook where all class members will share results, ask questions, etc.
- For those who want videos, this is not your type of class. There will be scores of photo examples and text explanations in addition to my availability to answer questions. This format has proven quite successful in the previous classes I have offered.
