Executive Director 4Cs Foundation 2006 - 2021 Responsible for overall administration of a community-based arts foundation promoting, building capacity, and offering grants for public community arts projects. Other duties included leadership, strategic planning and development, community liaison, training and supervising staff, and working with and reporting to the Board of Trustees.

Within this role I was responsible for identifying and developing a local (Halifax) arts organization to received a significant financial endowment from the 4Cs Foundation as it wound down its operations. Through my research, I identified the (then) emerging community art organization, **Wonder'neath Art Society** as an appropriate candidate. Over the next five years I worked closely mentoring the organization's founders and building the organization's capacity to become a registered charity and receive the endowment. This work included developing a strategic plan, facilitating sessions with the Founders to develop Mission Mandate, Vision and Values statements (https://www.wonderneath.com/identity), developing a Board Manual and transferring the Art Bikers program to Wonder'neath's care as a legacy project.

Founding Director and Coordinator Art Bikers 2007 - 2019 Conceptually imagined and co-founded a free mobile, community art program delivered by trained artist facilitators via bicycles and trailers throughout HRM. Recruited, trained and supervised employees; wrote handbook of policies and procedures.

Director Arts Engage! Symposium and Training 2010 Designed, organized and recruited artists from across Canada for a symposium to train local artists in facilitating and presenting community arts. The symposium simultaneously built a connected community of practitioners and offered a five-day training in creative facilitation. Secured co-funding from the Canada Council for the Arts, Arts Nova Scotia and the 4Cs Foundation. Compiled key outcomes and reported to funders.

Founding Coordinator/Host Community Arts Circle Network 2009 - 2019 Provided a network for sharing experiences and knowledge, including monthly gatherings, for community arts practitioners and others with an interest in community arts and public art projects.
