Julie DeVries Bio

Julie DeVries is a visual artist whose work includes paintings, installations, digital drawings, and animations of images from her memories and daily interactions with nature. She was born and raised in Houston, TX to an Argentine father and American mother and still currently lives and works there with her husband, photographer Sebastien Boncy, and her daughter Louise. She received her BFA from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago focusing on painting and Latin American art history and spent a semester studying abroad with family in Argentina. She then received her MFA in painting and drawing from the University of Houston. Her work has been collected both locally and nationally and has been exhibited in both commercial and non-profit spaces including the Houston Endowment's permanent collection. She currently serves as a Visual Arts faculty member at Lone Star College North Harris..

STATEMENT

My work records poignant visual experiences and memories from my daily, mostly suburban, surroundings into landscape imagery that extracts the sublime from the mundane and seeks to discover the curative connections between joy and grief often found in the natural world.

Subjects such as scraggly shrubs, uncut grass, and solitary trees are rendered in oil paintings and traditional and digital drawings; which are stylistically influenced by Latin American geometric abstraction; the animated backgrounds of Hayao Miyazaki films; the dreamlike paintings of Matthew Wong and Ann Craven; and the landscapes of New England painters Alex Katz and Lois Dodd. One series, entitled Memory Drawings, consists of digital landscapes drawn almost daily from memory which move away from the purely observational and into an oneiric space of distilled scenes capturing the light of Katz and Dodd and the surreal qualities of Wong and Craven.

More recently, new projects have pushed my work to evolve into other forms such as animations; commissioned vinyl and painted murals; and large-scale installations; all of which create an even more immersive experience for connecting with and finding comfort in that which is usually overlooked.
