



**WAYFINDERS WALK, a weekly pilgrimage to  
Gather Our Light, Widen Our Perspective &  
Connect Us to Place**

*This is the place. This is our place. This is our collective home.*

**What it is:** A weekly morning 1 mile (up and back) pilgrimage to Ensign Peak, meeting at Ensign Peak Nature Park in Salt Lake City at 8:00 AM and finishing by 9:00AM.

**How it will work:** We will gather every Sunday (the sun's day!) for 14 weeks, beginning March 22 on the weekend of the solar equinox, when daylight and dark are equal in share, and finishing Sunday June 21st on the summer solstice, the apex of light in our calendar year.

**What to expect?:** We will walk regardless of weather conditions, snow or shine. The 1/2 mile trail is short and moderately steep and accessible to most bodies and abilities. The walk up will be taken in silence and a simple mantra will be offered to keep in mind as we climb. Together, we will carry a newly created ensign — a flag symbol or banner designed by a local artist — representing the shared values and intentions of the pilgrimage. At the summit, we will place the ensign and engage in a brief guided embodied prayer or meditation before walking down in light-hearted community.

**Why do it?:** An opportunity for 14 weeks of, intentional communal walking to gather light, strength, clarity, purpose, unity...to meet new friends...to exercise...to see the glorious sunrise spread across our stunning valley...to experience shared silence...to honor the land and its beauty and the changing of the seasons with your unique attention...to learn more about the values of devotion and dedication by committing to spiritual practice...to center more meaning in your life...to improve and expand what it means to be in and stand for community and our homeland.

At its core, this is a unity consciousness raising project and an opportunity for spiritual discovery, self discovery, increased attunement to land, each other, and a collective future vision that centers well being for all beings, human and more than human.

**Why Ensign Peak?:** Ensign Peak sits on the ancestral territory of the Eastern Shoshone and Goshute peoples and holds layered histories of sacredness and meaning. This pilgrimage is not affiliated with the LDS church and is not a

condemnation nor an affirmation of LDS theology or history. It is, however, an acknowledgment of the power of place, land, and community when united under shared values to vision and build communities rooted in a hopeful future. May the power of Ensign Peak and the act of pilgrimage help us broadcast our intentions outward, upward, wherever goodness and better futures grow.

**Who is this for?/ What's required?:** Your participation and open heart are all that is required. No fees, no membership, no age restrictions, everyone welcome every time. The hope is that pilgrims will stick with the 14 week arc of this experience, but life happens, and participation every week is not required to attend. Come as you are when you can. Spread the word of this offering to those in your life so the experience can ripple outward. The only ask is to show up on time at 8:00 AM wearing weather appropriate gear, ready to walk.

**Who is organizing this?** Heart Honey Projects is the brainchild of Rev. Alli Harbertson, a social practice artist, ordained interfaith spiritual leader, and community and end of life chaplain. Heart Honey Projects are community offerings created to invite spiritual care, provide engagement with the sacred and living world, and restore connection to Self and each other. Alli wishes to acknowledge the collaborative support of Cityhome Collective in bringing this offering forward.

**And then what?** Spiritual practices, like this pilgrimage, that are held communally benefit from integration time together to digest and draw conclusions about what happened during the experience for individuals and for the collective. A listening session open to all participants along with a pop up show of all artists ensigns and ephemera from the pilgrimage are planned for July 2026. Date and location TBA.
