BUTTER COW: A MUPPET STYLE PUPPET OF A BUTTER COW (A LITERAL COW SCULPTED FROM BUTTER, OFTEN FOUND AT STATE FAIRS) FILLED WITH BOVINE NAIVETE AND PRIDEFUL BUTTERYNESS.

BQ:

Butter Cow, let me show you one of my favorite works of art in the museum - "Mound of Butter" by Antoine Vollon.

BC:

WOAH... This butter looks so good, I'm going to lick it!

BQ:

Not so fast, it's not *actually* butter. It's a still life painting. The artist is using paint illusionistically, making it appear sculptural and luscious.

BC:

I can't believe it's not butter!

BQ:

When you look closely, you can see the artists' tools at work. You can see he used, brushes, knives, rags, even his finger!

BC:

I am honored, it's like I have a family portrait right here in the National Gallery of Art.

BQ:

Well, you do come from a *cultured*
butter family...
